St. John School Learning Journey Service Project

2024: Hurricane Helene and Milton Support. Our Learning Journey this year is called "Seasons for a Reason" which focuses on how God so masterfully created our world to provide us four distinct seasons, and how that correlates to Christ's life here on earth. Each Learning Journey has traditionally included a Service Project. With student input, it was decided we should collect items to support those who have been impacted by Hurricane Helen and Milton. We will be focusing on two ways to help these families: Collecting Hygiene Kits and Disaster Cleaning



Bucket Kits. Disaster Buckets should be a 5 gallon bucket with lid containing: Scrub brush, AJAX scrub powder, long cleaning gloves, all purpose cleaners such as Lysol, Pine Sol ect., 1 hand towel, window cleaner, Clorox bleach, roll of paper towels, hand wipes and N95 masks-NIOSH approved. Hygiene Kits should contain: 1 bath towel, 1 wash cloth, 1 bath size bar of soap, 1 plastic soap box holder, 1 toothbrush, 1 sturdy comb, 6 band-aids 1/2" or 3/4", 1 small pack of facial tissue, 1 nail clipper and 1 piece of strong ribbon or cord. Assembly: Lay out towel, fold over about 5" on each long side, place the rest of the items in the center under the folds, use the ribbon or the cord to tie the towel up in the middle. These kits can be dropped off in the Narthex in the place provided or dropped off at school by November 1st. These items will be dropped off at the Orphan Grain Train Warehouse in Westfield WI on November 5th. Any questions contact Principal Diane Goetsch.
